I.R.S. GRANTS TAX EXEMPT STATUS

In a long awaited decision, the Internal Revenue Service has approved an Oxbow, Inc. request for 501-C3 tax exempt status. With this tax exempt status in place, 100% of all donations, contributions and membership fees made to Oxbow, Inc. during the year may now be reported as charitable contributions on the 1986 tax return. After 1986, only those filing an itemized deductions return will be entitled to claim charitable contributions made to non-profit organizations.

Sources within the Ohio Department of Natural Resources have made it known that the department would very much like to see the Oxbow-Hardintown-Horseshoe Bottoms area preserved and protected but that a problem exists in the fact that much of the area lies within the borders of Indiana. The ODNR would like a commitment from the Indiana Department of Natural Resources that they would agree to protect that portion that lies within their boundary. However, the administrators in the IDNR do not, as this time, consider the area to be a high priority in their land acquisition program.

It is evident that Oxbow, Inc. needs all of our concerned Indiana organizations and residents to write both the Governor and the Director of the IDNR asking them to reconsider their priorities and request they work with the Director of the ODNR to have this unique area preserved and protected.

RESEARCH COMMITTEE

Good news comes from a research paper presented to the Hamilton County Park Board and made available to Oxbow, Inc.

Work done on butterflies and moths around the boat ramp area of Shawnee-Lookout Park, that is also applicable to the Oxbow-Hardintown-Horseshoe Bottoms area, turned up the moth, <u>Idaea Scintillularia</u> (Hulst). This southern species was not known from Ohio until the specimen from Shawnee-Lookout was recorded on June 1, 1986. This is the northern-most sighting of this moth in the United States and is also a state record. It is a discovery that strengthens the case for habitat preservation in the Oxbow.
