

BUT, WHERE IS IT!



For all the members who support Oxbow, Inc. but are not familiar with the area, the shaded portion of the map represents the 2500-acre floodplain and wetlands contiguous to the Ohio-Indiana state line. Stippled areas identify land committed to preservation by various conservation organizations.

The delineation of the properties is not to scale but represents the approximate location of each parcel.

The Oxbow is a special place for wildlife. Most Oxbow land is privately owned and not all owners welcome strangers. There are no picnic tables or other facilities for human visitors. The dirt roads are for farm vehicles and, when wet, will quietly swallow a car. This is bird country. Members can visit nearby Shawnee Lookout Park from which they can look out over the Oxbow. Those wanting a closer look can join one of the frequent birding trips conducted by Oxbow, Inc.

A LITTLE STORY


