

"It has been determined by the Board of Trustees of the First National Bank that the Kreigenhofer estate may not be sold to assist in the purchase of the Gilmore Ponds area. This would have been the key financial amount needed to purchase a major section of the ponds

The Isaac Walton League of America (IWLA) Hamilton Chapter has submitted a proposal to the City of Hamilton stating what the intended use of the area would be and how it would be controlled and maintained for all of us to enjoy.

The Gilmore Ponds acquisition project has a balance of over \$5500.00. We sincerely thank all of you for your kind and generous donations. This area deserves protection and you can be assured we will do all that we can to accomplish just that!"

Oxbow, Inc. members interested in walking the Gilmore Ponds area are invited to do so. The ponds may be reached by taking Route 4 North of I-275. Turn right onto Bypass 4. Take the second road to the left (Symmes). Go ½ mile and park across the road from the water tower. Walk into the ponds area from there. Rails, grebes, coots and rusty blackbirds have been sighted. Take a 'scope if you have one.

THE CINCINNATI ZOO AND BOTANICAL GARDENS is supportive of Oxbow, Inc.

Thane Maynard, Assistant Curator of Education, wrote an article which was carried in the Zoo's newsletter. This publication reaches over 30,000 people. The article, entitled "Save the Oxbow", pointed out that loss of habitat takes a greater toll on wildlife each year than poaching, pestacides and all other threats to species combined. Referring to the Oxbow area, Thane continued, "The Cincinnati Zoo is fully supportive of the efforts to save this area. Zoo Director, Ed Maruska, serves on the Scientific Advisory Board of Oxbow, Inc. as do Zoo photographer Ron Austing and Curator of Education Barry Wakeman. Dr. Betsy Dresser also serves as an advisor to the group." Thane concluded by stating, "Work is underway to preserve this area, but it cannot happen without local support to prove that the Oxbow is as important to people as it is to the birds."

TUESDAY, JUNE 9TH, 7:30 P.M. - Greendale Cabin, Greendale, Indiana. (See map).


The speaker will be an Indiana conservation officer from the Indiana Department of Natural Resources.
